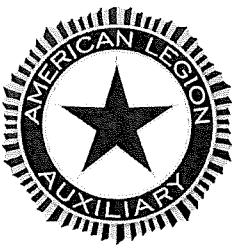

Hello Legion Members,

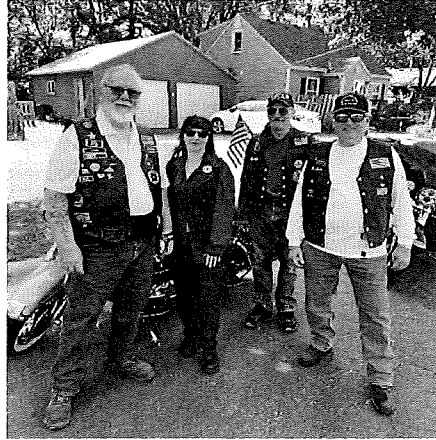
The Riders are having an active summer with a number of fun events.

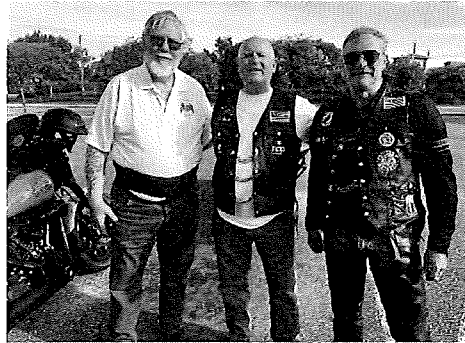

Our Riders and their bikes in the staging area –



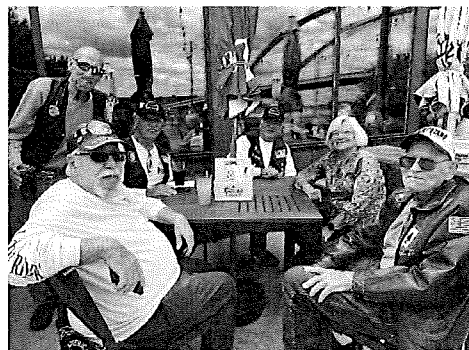
Our Riders after the parade –

Paid 2027 Membership is at 222 members, 280 members short of the goal.

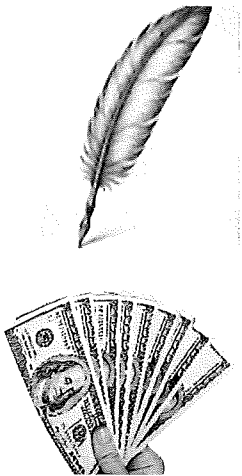

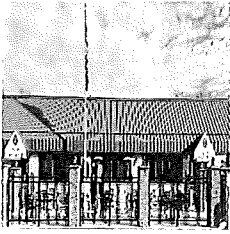

Dear Fellow Legionnaires,

On July 7, we introduced a HOT BALL worth \$200 during our bingo sessions. After sales are closed for the 1st game, the seller will draw a ball from the hopper, which determines the HOT BALL for the session. If you win bingo on that number, you receive an additional \$200.00. Customers are happy we continue to add new exciting things to our bingo program, which makes our team happy. To hear the feedback. Our overall mission is to provide an exciting and entertaining night out at Post 39.

We have two bingo sessions each week. Tuesday's session starts at 6 p.m., and on Saturdays, we start at 4 p.m. We have 10 games, 3 each session, with the last one being a \$1,000 coverall, with a \$200 consolation prize if bingo is not reached in the predetermined number of balls. Game #6 is a new progressive game starting off at \$200 and goes up \$25 each week until it's won. You must get 39 in 39 balls called or less to win. \$99 is the consolation prize.

Friday Night Meat Raffles at 4:00 p.m., with tickets starting at \$1.00. We will be raffling off roughly 12 packages each week. Virtual Racing starts at 4:00 p.m. during the meat raffle. Tickets are \$1.00 each, with multiple payouts ranging from \$50 to \$500.00.

We have three cash raffles weekly here at Post 39.

Wednesday is a \$5.00 raffle ticket (200 tickets) "Hump Day" which pays out \$700.00.

Friday is a \$1.00 raffle ticket (800 tickets) "Lucky Buck" which pays out \$500.00.

Sunday is a \$5.00 raffle ticket (200 tickets) "Sunday-Funday" which pays out \$700.00.

We have 4 \$1 boxes, 3 \$2 boxes, a \$5 box, and 12 Etabs with Booty Bingo.
